CRITICAL ISSUES

in Indian River County

Veterans in Need:

- 6,000 living in or close to poverty.
- · Over 4,000 disabled, dozens homeless.
- 220 in case management with a wait list of 17 for critical home repairs, dire dental needs, and health treatments.

Mental Health:

- 1120 youths have been hospitalized for mood and depression disorders.
- IRC County has only one mental health provider for every 640 residents.

At-Risk Children:

- 22% live in poverty, 76% are in single-parent homes.
- Only 45% are ready for kindergarten.

The Homeless:

- · 925 homeless individuals in IRC
- · 736 adults and 189 children.

The needs in our Indian River County are ENORMOUS. Our next-door neighbor, Gifford, has the highest poverty rate (60%) in all of Florida—6 times the average. Some of the more profound stressors for the people we support are:

- The demands on single-parent families
- · Lack of food security
- Inadequate shelter
- Deficient access to early educational opportunities

Outreach volunteers have identified, researched, visited, and vetted over 30 agencies focusing on the underserved in our greater community.

100% of your contributions go directly to them.

Here is the potential impact of your generous contributions:

\$10,000 - Provides the salary for a Mental Health Counselor at The Source...for 20 clients.

\$5,000 - Supports one child for a full year of GYAC Academic Enrichment; funds 2 students through UAP STEP program or creates home handicap accessibility for disabled Vets.

\$1000 - Feeds 21 families for a week at the Hope for Families Center.

\$500 - Funds a GYAC teacher salary for 2 weeks.

\$100 - Provides school supplies for 1 homeless child at the Hope for Families Center or keeps electricity on for a veteran for a month.


- Putting and Chipping Contests




The success of the campaign is attributable to the people of Grand Harbor - we are deeply gratified and humbled by the outpouring of support.
